Good morning!

Following your discussion at Monday night's meeting on the PVEMS and insurance providers, I contacted Mr. Mark Long, Constituent Outreach Specialist, of Representative Benninghoff's Office, following up on the status of HB 1013 (Act 103 of 2018), which was mentioned by Ms. Keri Miller. https://www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/li/uconsCheck.cfm?yr=2018&sessInd=0&act=103

Mr. Long agreed to research the matter on your behalf and below is the response that he emailed to me this morning. I hope that you find this information helpful. I am sure that Mark would be more than happy to research further any questions that you might have.

"Below is what the Ambulance Association of PA has shared with the provider community regarding this type of inquiry:

This is what we sent to our members anticipating meeting in February with insurers:

As many of you are aware, Act 103 of 2018 was signed by the Governor that prohibits the denial of a claim for payment for necessary emergency services rendered by a transporting EMS Agency "solely because the enrollee did not require transport or refused to be transported" – Treat-No Transport.

While the "effective" date of this statute is December 23, 2018, we do not anticipate third party insurers or Medicaid will be paying claims immediately or in the coming year. This is related to statute and regulations requiring carriers to file forms and specific plan changes with the Insurance Department or the federal government, something the AAP has no control over.

These changes are then reviewed, approved or disapproved and when finalized are not in effect until the next coverage year. Therefore, given the effective date of the bill and the grace period of 180 days for the carriers to file these documents we anticipate that the acceptance of claims by the carriers for services covered under the Act would start in the summer of 2020.

The AAP is taking this time to work with the Insurance industry, the Insurance Department, Department of Human Services and members of the General Assembly to negotiate an acceptable standardized coding process amongst the carriers and Medicaid creating tangible guidelines with which to educate the provider community.

We ask for your patience during this process. Information will be provided as soon as it is available."

One of the most fundamental responsibilities of every township is to protect the health, welfare, and safety of its residents. Whatever the natural and man-made hazards your township faces, it must prepare to "handle them all". Thank you for the opportunity to quote you my services.

Based on our conversation, you requested pricing for a new PC and new backup service. This is what I recommend:

Dell Inspiron Desktop PC Intel Core i5 processor 8 GB DDR4 memory 500 GB Solid State Hard Drive DVD Burner Windows 10 1 Year Warranty Price for the PC \$729.99 Plus tax

You did not mention a monitor. If a monitor is needed, I would use a 23" widescreen monitor that would run in the \$175 range.

For the backup, I recommend you use a External USB drive. Generally a 1 TB drive is large enough. Cost for the drive is \$65. If a larger size is needed I can double the size for approximately \$20 more.

In addition to the USB backup, you should also use an offsite service. I use Carbonite backup for all my business clients. For one PC it would be \$72.99 per year. This would allow you to backup all your files automatically.

Lastly, I charge \$80/hr for labor. This would include setting up the PC, transferring files from the old PC to new, setting up printers, connecting to network and configuring the backup. It would be impossible to guess the duration of my visit. I've been involved in similar setups that ranged from 1 hour to 4 hours. Each client is unique. The amount of data I'm moving plays a large part.

Most computers I order are delivered to me in 2-3 days. Therefore, it would be safe to say that I could be onsite within a week of your approval to move forward.

With new clients, I do ask for a payment upfront for the hardware. In this case, I would ask for \$250 deposit before we proceed. In the future, I normally purchase all hardware myself and then bill the client for my parts and labor once the job is completed.



It was suggested at the December meeting that the parties contact Center for Alternatives in Community Justice. CACJ performs mediations at no cost, and its representatives obviously do a conflict check before proceeding. I don't really know them, as they typically address family law matters that are outside of my day-to-day, so they're certainly not affiliated with me in any way.

I have no plan other than contacting them and requesting their assistance in resolving these RTKL and any related matters. As mediators, they will take it from there, in terms of having the parties spell out their positions and then attempting to find common ground.

Does that work for you? We may well disagree on the merits of each side's perspective, but the mediation procedures should not be controversial.





PA House Bill 2564 Thwarted, But is Expected to Rise Again; FCC Issues New Wireless Order

Thanks to you and the hundreds of other local officials who voiced their concern to state legislators, the "Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Bill" (PA House Bill 2564) failed to be voted out of the Consumer Affairs Committee before the close of the 2017-18 legislative session. Defeating the bill was a victory for local governments and their ability to manage their rights-of-way. The reason the bill was stopped is clear: local officials throughout the Commonwealth raised their voices in opposition. Thanks to all of you who took a stand.

House Bill 2564

Promoted by Verizon and AT&T, HB 2564 would have stripped municipalities of their zoning authority over wireless poles and antennas in the rights-of-way and drastically cut the fees municipalities could assess to \$25 per site per year. Although the bill failed in the last legislative session, the wireless industry is preparing for another fight. According to the Philadelphia Inquirer (10/16/18), the sponsor of HB 2564 has vowed to reintroduce the bill in 2019. If a new bill is introduced, it would have a new bill number, but its impact would be the same: to preempt PA municipalities from managing wireless facilities and recovering their costs for use of the rights-of-way.

The number of these "small wireless facilities" is expected to grow dramatically over the

next several years. According to CTIA, which represents the wireless industry, there were approximately 86,000 small cells in 2018, and it estimates there will be over 800,000 by 2026. PA municipalities emphatically support the deployment of 5G technology and have approved wireless facilities in the rights-of-way for over 7 years. Still, local officials insist on a responsible and orderly rollout of these facilities. We will notify you as soon as a new bill is introduced.

FCC Wireless Order

Meanwhile, as discussed in our prior Action Alert, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) issued its Declaratory Ruling and Third Report and Order on September 27, 2018 and it will become effective on January 14, 2019. The 98-page Order establishes new rules for local regulation of wireless facilities in the rights-of-way and it applies to Pennsylvania municipalities.

Among other requirements, the Order defines "small wireless facilities," shortens the "shot clock" time frames for taking action on wireless facility applications, limits one-time application and recurring right-of-way fees (but not nearly as low as the fees in HB 2564). and establishes new guidelines for local aesthetic standards for new facilities. Unlike HB 2564, the FCC Order does not preempt municipal zoning authority over wireless facilities.

Given the changes required by the new FCC Order and the likelihood that you'll be receiving more applications for wireless facilities in the rights-of-way, now is the time to either update your current ordinance or enact a new wireless ordinance. An updated wireless ordinance will allow your municipality to manage these new facilities, protect the public rights-of-way, collect fees consistent with federal and state law, and preserve, to the greatest extent possible, the character of your community.

I am the solicitor for Gregg Township. As I think you know, Gregg Township has received a number of Right-to-Know Law requests from Casey and Michelle Grove, who are cc'ed on this email. At a recent township meeting, a Gregg Township resident mentioned that you would be willing to provide mediation services relating to Mr. and Mrs. Grove's RTKL requests. We are reaching out to you to confirm or deny that interest. If you are interested, we would like to know how to get this process started with your office.

Before you commit, I want to clarify an issue regarding any potential mediation. As Mr. and Mrs. Grove and I have already discussed, I do not see much value in attempting to mediate and resolve each individual RTKL request, as there is not much middle ground on them. For example, if a request seeks attorney-client privileged materials, which is a common issue, it is difficult to really reach a middle ground on whether to disclose those documents. Mr. and Mrs. Grove would also have difficulty agreeing to a settlement on that kind of issue without viewing the relevant documents. However, we do see value in mediating the overall dispute. Mr. and Mrs. Grove obviously have reasons for filing the RTKL requests, and the Township's issue is more focused on the means by which the disputes are being pursued. I see great value in having a mediation to address those structural concerns. Perhaps we can try to mediate the pending RTKL requests to an extent, but I just want to make sure that we communicate this interest in resolving the overall matters, to the extent possible.

Happy New Year!

I wanted to share some news from state government with you.

1. DCED Toll Free 800 number

Some of you have asked. The DCED toll free phone line has been out of service since December 14 and there is no estimated return to service date. We have not been given any guidance for phone contact in the interim. Sorry for any inconvenience you may experience. As soon as we hear something, we will pass it along.

2. Statewide EIT Collections

We learned recently that the Department of Revenue report/Feasibility study of statewide EIT collection is now posted on the Department's website www.revenue.pa.gov

Quick summary

Option 1 – No change to the current process. Costs would be as they are now. Pros would include the increased revenue that has been achieved, the increased cash flow and the increased accountability. Cons would be inconsistency among the Tax Officers and the broad range of fees charged by the Tax Officers.

Option 2 – The Department would administer EIT. First year costs would be \$56 million and recurring costs would be \$36 million. Pros would be lower future administrative costs, easier taxpayer compliance and increased individual electronic filing. Cons would be loss of local control, sunk costs and loss of direct customer service and high initial investment. Option 3 – The Department would process individual and withholding EIT returns and all other functions would remain with the Tax Officers. First year costs would be \$75 million and recurring costs would be \$61 million. Pros would be easier taxpayer compliance, Tax Officers remain in place and increased electronic filing. The cons would be higher administrative costs and high initial investment.

The Administration will not be advocating for a specific position and will leave it up to the General Assembly how best to proceed.

Call for 2019 STIC Incentive Program Funding Submissions

The Pennsylvania STIC is holding an open call for project submissions for 2019 STIC Incentive Program funding. Every year, FHWA offers up to \$100,000 to support the costs of standardizing innovation practices in a state transportation agency. PennDOT also provides a 20 percent match for STIC Incentive Program funding for a total award of up to \$120,000.

Requests for STIC Incentive Program funding must be submitted to Karyn Vandervoort (karyn.vandervoort@dot.gov) at FHWA by Friday, March 15, 2019. Please ensure the request includes a brief description or white paper about the innovation and the estimated cost. Provide as much detail as possible for PennDOT and FHWA leadership to fully understand the innovation and how the funding will assist in its implementation. See below to learn more about the 2018 STIC Incentive Program funding project recipients and learn how these funds can provide vital resources for several types of transportation projects across Pennsylvania.

2018 STIC Incentive Program Funding Project Recipients: Where are they now?

The 2018 STIC Incentive Program funding was shared among three projects:

Workforce Preparedness Study for Electronic Contracting and Communications (e-Construction)

PennDOT, in cooperation with the Associated Pennsylvania Constructors (APC) and the Pennsylvania

Turnpike Commission (PTC), is currently developing a statewide study of PennDOT employees, PTC employees, consultants and contractors to determine their level of familiarity and understanding of electronic contracting (e-Construction) and communications (Partnering) and how those concepts can complement one another to result in quality construction projects.

Two workshops were conducted in July and November with smaller stakeholder groups to gain an initial understanding of perceptions, capabilities, needs and concerns. The feedback gathered from the workshops will be compiled with the survey results, and a final report will be released in 2019. The report will identify strategies to support the proper training and skills development needed to evolve to paperless jobsites, while helping to foster a culture of cooperation and communication among project teams.

e-Construction is a paperless construction delivery process that includes electronic submission of documentation.

PennSTART - Traffic Incident Management (TIM) Training Center



PennSTART is a state-of-the-art training and testing facility for the Mid-Atlantic region.

PennDOT, the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission and the Pennsylvania State University are partnering to create a state-of-the-art training and testing facility using STIC Incentive Program funding to help make that vision a reality. The facility will include a mile-long test track to benefit emergency responders, transportation institutions and research organizations in addressing transportation safety training and research needs in traffic incident management, Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) and tolling, high-speed and mobile work-zone operations, traffic

control testing and evaluation, safety certification opportunities, and smart truck-parking applications. It will also provide controlled environments for testing various connected and automated vehicle technologies. The test track would support vehicle test speeds of up to 70 miles per hour. The team has completed the Phase 1 feasibility study and is using the STIC Incentive Program funding for Phase 2, which includes determination of the concept of operations and system requirements for the planned facility. The facility, whose location remains to be finalized, is expected to open in 2022. For more information on this training center, visit the PennDOT PennSTART webpage.

Geosynthetic Reinforced Soil-Integrated Bridge System (GRS-IBS) Specification

GRS-IBS allows PennDOT and municipalities to build bridges in a quick and cost-effective manner, using local workforce personnel and equipment to maximize efficiency. This method of building bridges involves using closely spaced layers of geotextile combined with crushed

and graded stone and concrete facing blocks to construct the bridge abutments. Since September 2013, over 20 bridges have been completed using GRS-IBS technology and PennDOT is now working on updates to the current GRS-IBS specification to expand the use of this method to more locations. The effort seeks to expand the current limitations on average daily traffic (ADT) volumes and span length and explores different ways to protect bridge abutments from stream erosion.

Using 2017 and 2018 STIC Incentive Program funding, PennDOT engaged the Pennsylvania State University to assist with providing justifications for specification enhancements. This contract includes researching specifications of other states, evaluating data and

making recommendations for the updated design standards. Additional data from PennDOT systems and past projects will be evaluated against the goals of the project and will be utilized to update the specification.







Response from Rep. Benninghoff's Office on Amish vehicles

Dear Regional Planning Commission Members,

In an effort to respond to your concerns regarding Amish vehicles, I touched base with Representative Benninghoff's Office. I asked if Representative Benninghoff would be available to attend your March 18th meeting. Mr. Mark Long informed me that the PA House of Representatives is in session on March 18th and April 15th; however, Representative Benninghoff is available on May 20th. (Note: I also plan to contact the other legislative offices in the next day or so.) As part of my conversation with Mr. Long, I mentioned the concerns that you had expressed on January 21st. Mr. Long offered to follow through and below is what he learned on the two issues:

Mr. Mark Long, Constituent Outreach Specialist for Representative Kerry Benninghoff, had contacted the House Transportation Committee at the Capitol regarding your inquiries into previously proposed legislation by Rep. Mike Hanna that horse drawn vehicles be registered and the issue of age limits put on kids who are driving various horse-drawn "vehicles" on the roads.

As to House Bill 1670 proposed by Rep. Hanna in the 2017-18 session, Representative Hanna was the only sponsor of the legislation, and the bill did not receive any traction. Attached please find the legislation, which was provided by Representative Benninghoff's Office.

According to the Transportation Committee where the bill had been sent for consideration, it would have cost more to administer than it would have brought in funding. When Mr. Long asked for more specific thoughts as to the non-affordability of such legislation, it was explained that a \$36 fee would not even begin to cover the costs of starting a program to register these vehicles. Different from autos and trucks that have Manufacturer Statements of Origin that are used to create a vehicle title, carriages don't have that. PennDOT would have to create VIN numbers to be affixed to the vehicles and transfers of ownership and titles would need to be created. Forms and certified PennDOT agents would need to be trained in the nuances of wooden vehicles and the registration criteria. Education of owners of these vehicles would have to be widespread and an outreach program throughout the Commonwealth would be expensive. Training of law enforcement personnel would also be very expensive.

So boiling it all down, it was their opinion that such legislation would be a drain on PennDOT and actually pull money away from road improvement projects.

On the subject of an age limit for agricultural or Amish drivers, there is an age restriction of 14 or older for motorized implements of husbandry, i.e. tractors. However, regarding any human or animal powered vehicles, there is no age restriction. The Transportation Committee doesn't believe any legislation on that issue is anticipated since accidents with children operating these are rare, statistically speaking.

A special thanks goes to Mr. Mark Long of Representative Benninghoff's Office for his excellent constituent service.

I hope that you find this information helpful.



Hi Doug-

We just discussed the documents you provided with our engineer and have the following suggestions:

In the executive summary we recommend changing the statement regarding the use of residential HVAC equipment and removing the statement about commercial HVAC not being EE rated (not correct) and replacing it with:

"Multiple smaller capacity (modular) light commercial high efficiency heat pumps with sealed combustion gas furnaces meeting or exceeding the 2015 International Energy Conservation Code requirements and ASHRAE 90.1 will be used"

Our mechanical engineer has indicated that residential and light commercial equipment is essentially the same and the energy code requirements must be met by commercial/light commercial equipment. A few questions were raised as to what you will be doing to introduce fresh air (ventilation air) into the system, and also whether or not natural gas is available or will there be large propane tanks? Propane doesn't like to get very cold, so may need to bury tanks?

In the Statement of Work, the engineer suggested tweaking the second to last line to read:

"The exterior wiring and coolant/heat lines will be covered with line set cover systems and/or metal enclosures."

Hopefully this helps out!

Hello Claudia and Glenn,

Thank you very much for your prompt helpful feedback! I have a question re the engineer's statement; "Multiple smaller capacity (modular) light commercial high efficiency heat pumps **With** sealed combustion gas furnaces meeting or exceeding the 2015 International Energy Conservation Code requirements and ASHRAE 90.1 will be used". Should "with" be replaced with **and** or along with? Are heat pumps and gas furnaces manufactured as a single unit? By the way, I appreciate being corrected on my understanding of commercial equipment and energy efficiency ratings.

Also, we have been using outdoor, surface-mounted propane tanks, at our equipment shed, for over thirty years and here at the OGS for the past seven years; there have been no issues with cold weather. Is the concern about pressure being reduced by cold weather and/or frozen water in the gas lines? We have four 100 gallon tanks at the OGS and two at the equipment shed.

I have not thought about fresh air ventilation because this old building has a great deal of air leakage and the hallways are and will be used as cold air returns to the gas furnaces. Also, with so many people coming and going, doors are constantly being opened and closed. I don't have any air-exchange calculations. I suppose some of the univents could be kept in servce to draw in fresh air? This is an important issue I didn't consider; thank you!

I would appreciate any comments you may want to add to the thoughts I have expressed here.

We also understand about infiltration being the main source of fresh air! We live in an 1840s stone house and will never have to worry about sick building syndrome! Over time, I'm guessing that Old Gregg School may begin to tighten up some of the infiltration at which point ventilation air will become more important...you also have operable windows, which helps.
