Board of Supervisor's Meeting
Thursday, September 12, 2024 @ 6:30 pm
Room 203

The regularly scheduled Board of Supervisors (BOS) meeting for Gregg Township, Centre County, was held on September 12, 2024, at 106 School Street, Suite 203, Spring Mills, PA with Chair Charles Stover, Ben Haupt, and Vicky Vanada. Others in attendance: David Gaines, Solicitor.

Chair Charles Stover called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm., followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Ben Haupt gave a 911 Remembrance speech, followed by a minute of silence and then a prayer.

Chair Charles Stover asked Marty Malone, ATCS Engineer to give his presentation/update on Bitner Hollow Road. Marty asked if the township might be interested in applying for future grants. Marty's partner, Husam Obeid gave update. Permit for plans were submitted on August 15, 2024 and he said that it typically takes about 28 business days for the review. Husam said that he will bring the plans to the next Gregg Twp BOS meeting for approval and signatures.

In regards to the culvert pipes, ATCS will need to inspect the culvert pipes and if the pipes are not in too bad of shape, the most cost-effective fix would be to reline the pipes. The following steps need to occur:

1. Conduct a field survey to check/inspect pipes
2. Hydraulic study
3. Feasibility study:
 - a. Box culvert
 - b. Reline pipes

ATCS will provide Gregg Twp with an electronic files of their study.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

1. Denise Immel – Two questions:
 - a. When will prosecution begin with previous secretary?
 - b. Questioned why it was on the agenda for this evening that we were considering requesting bids for snow removal. Denise asked why we were spending additional funds that we don't have. Denise reported that Millheim Borough roadcrew takes care of their municipality plowing and questioned why Gregg Township Roadcrew does not do the same.
Denise asked if the snow removal contract would be for a set period of time or per snow storm.
2. Donna Miller – Gregg Township Tax Collector – Gave update on RBA & GSS Tax Collections. GSS has not provided much information on their process.
3. Lisa Bierlein – Stated that she has heard in the community, that the BOS are not interested in prosecuting the previous secretary and asked if that was true. David Gaines, Solicitor stated that this was reported to the state police as soon as we learned of it and the state police are investigating. Lisa then stated that the dollar amount was provided to the residents at last month's township meeting and Lisa asked if that dollar amount was provided to the State Police and David Gaines, Solicitor stated that it was

shared with the State Police. Lisa then asked how much contact the solicitor/BOS have with the State Police. David Gaines, Solicitor stated that there is not daily communication but if we have a question, we call the State Police and if they have an update they will contact us.

Lisa asked if financials as well as draft meeting minutes will be provided to the public at the meetings/online.

4. Chuck Bierlein – Stated that there is a lot of silence in regards to the previous secretary/investigation. David Gaine, Solicitor stated that the State Police have instructed the BOS and Solicitor to not talk about the investigation.

SOLICITOR REPORT

1. David Gaines, Solicitor reiterated that this is an open investigation and we are limited on what we can discuss. David said that the State Police have received Integrity Accounting's report of the theft.
2. There are no updates from the Bonding Company due to their investigation of the events that occurred.
3. There is a hearing on October 2nd on the nuisance property. David feels that this hearing may get rescheduled and he will let the BOS and those on his email chain know if that happens.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Jim Smith is on vacation.

FIRE COMPANY

Troy Parker, Fire Chief said that there were ten calls in August.

1. Troy said that we are in the wild fire season and ask those that burn, to be careful.
2. The fire company will be having their gun raffle on September 28th
3. Bingo will begin in October and that the 1st Bingo in October will be on Saturday and then it will go back to Fridays after the initial Bingo
4. Gregg Twp. Fire Company is purchasing a fire engine. Troy said that he will be getting rescue tools with the fire engine, so they will have two sets of rescue tools. Troy said that this engine will hold more water. Fire Company is in the process of selling the old engine.

OGS ADVISORY BOARD

Carol Gingrich said that the Advisory Board is working on updating Old Gregg Schools forms. Once the forms are updated, they will need to go to David for review.

1. **Ghostly Gallop (Run/Walk)** will be held on October 26, 2024 and will begin at 9 am and the fee is \$25.00 per runner/walker. The Sponsorship fee is \$200.00 and the sponsors name will be placed on the back of the T-shirts that will be given to the runners/walkers.
2. **Winter Craft Show** will be held on December 7, 2024 from 10 am to 2 pm. Vendors can sign up online and the vendor fee is \$25.00. Carol said that the Nittany Valley Railroad will open their doors during the craft show and Carol said that they have a wonderful display and encouraged folks to go see their display.
3. Applied for **Day of Caring** on Thursday, October 3rd for help with the landscaping

4. Carol requested that the snow removal bidding be tabled for this BOS meeting so that it can be ran through the Advisory Board first. BOS agreed to table this for it to go through Advisory Board first.

PHYSICAL PLANT MANAGER

Jim Smith is on vacation. Carol Gingerich gave the report Jim gave at the Advisory Board meeting. Convention oven in main kitchen is not working properly. Carol said that the oven is old and has been here since this was an elementary school. Repairs were done in Inside-Out Cookie room.

PV CODE ENFORCEMENT

Justin Dashem said that were four building permits for August. Zach Gays subdivision site distances were fine.

PVEMS – Chair Charles Stover gave report. Possibly replacing the oldest ambulance within the next year or possibly refurbishing it. Charles reported that a new ambulance could cost around \$370,000. Charles reported that PVEMS has monies set aside for this replacement.

PVRPC – Ben Haupt gave report. Quarterly meeting will be on September 24th.

PLANNING COMMISSION – Ben Haupt gave report. Last meeting was on September 3, 2024 @ 6:30 pm in the gym. Ben said they barely had enough members to have a quorum for the meeting. Ben said that residents did not come to the meeting so the short-term rental discussion was tabled until next months meeting. Ben said that the planning commission's goal is not to regulate, rather make it so that there can be short-term rentals.

WATER AND SEWER Authority

Jim Smith is on vacation. Ben Haupt reported that they are digging up pipes to check for lead. They are also doing GPS making. Ben reported that the sewer plant on Kline Road needs to be replaced and the sewer authority is checking into the guidelines.

SECRETARY/TREASURER'S REPORT

Correction to the August 8, 2024 meeting minutes – Under Water and Sewer, take out the work "galvanized" so that it will read – "DEP and EPA need to check that there are no lead pipes." No further discussion. With corrections, Ben Haupt made a motion to accept the August 8, 2024 meeting minutes and Chair Charles Stover second the motion. The vote in favor was unanimous, 3-0.

Financial Report provided by Integrity Accounting – Ben Haupt made a motion to accept report. Second by Chair Charles Stover. The vote in favor was unanimous, 3-0.

ROADMASTER'S REPORT

Roadmaster Brandon Ripka not present. Ben Haupt gave report. Road crew has been mowing, fixing shoulders, took care of tree on Blue Ball Road and fixed a shoulder on Green Grove Road.

Unfinished Business:

1. Marty Mallone – ATCS Engineering – Update on Bitner Hollow Road - Report given at beginning of meeting
2. Internet Update – Given by Ben Haupt. Awaiting arrival of Internet wiring. Will then get wiring in place and then Link will get the building connected to the internet.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Zach Gay – Mill Dam Road Subdivision – Zach not present
2. Fire Hall Road (by Frosty Hook) closure on Friday, September 20, 2024 for Mr. Young's sale. Motion for approval made by Ben Haupt. Second by Charles Stover. No further discussion. The vote in favor was unanimous, 3-0.
3. Celesta Powell – Request an ordinance change. Celesta said that she has lived at her residence for 24 years and the road is a township road. She said there are a few bike races throughout the year and the event holders post arrows on private property to keep the participants on the correct roads. She said there are three families that live full-time on Decker Valley Road and when there are bike races, it effects their ability to get to/from their residences. She said that Section 8, 106 covers Special Events. She said she is looking for clarity regarding the event. Possibly personal notification and markings at the beginning and ending of the roads. Celesta said that she would like to see an ordinance that residents are notified prior to the event and that signage is not to be put on private property. Celesta said that with the current ordinance, that there is \$25.00 fee if the event holders do not follow the rules and that possibly the fee could be set a little higher. Celesta said that the event holders should be the responsible party to notify the residents when their township road is being used for a special event.
4. 2024 Fee Schedule – Motion made by Ben Haupt to accept current fee schedule for now and then revisit the fee schedule for 2025. Second by Chair Charles Stover. The vote in favor was unanimous, 3-0.
5. Short-term rental – Ben gave update that this will be discussed at the October 7th Planning Commission meeting. Ben said that this was tabled at the September meeting because there were not any residents that attended the planning commission meeting. Justin Dashem, PV Code stated that the State has put this topic on the back burner for now.
6. Jim Smith requested to start process of receiving bids for snow removal. This has been tabled for now. Needs to go through the Advisory Board first.
7. Gregg Township town-wide yard sales is on Friday, September 13, 2024 & Saturday, September 14, 2024.
8. Gregg Township trick-or-treat will be on Thursday, October 31, 2024 from 6 to 8 pm.
